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een nieuwe vertaling van martin heideggers belangrijkste werk zijn en tijd sein und zeit oorspronkelijk gepubliceerd in 1927 in meerdere publicaties deze editie bevat een nieuw nawoord van de vertaler een tijdlijn van heideggers leven en werk een filosofische index van heideggeriaanse kernbegrippen en een terminologiewijzer voor 19e en 20e eeuwse existentialisten deze vertaling is ontworpen met het oog op leesbaarheid en toegankelijkheid van heideggers raadselachtige en dichte filosofie complexe en specifieke filosofische termen zijn zo letterlijk mogelijk vertaald en academische voetnoten zijn verwijderd om het lezen te vergemakkelijken zijn en tijd presenteert een complex filosofisch discours over de aard van het zijn sein en de tijd zeit met bijzondere aandacht voor het temporeel existentialistische concept van dasein een term die de duitse woorden voor zijn sein en er da combineert dit klassieke filosofische werk onderzoekt het traditionele metafysische begrip van het zijn en stelt dat dit begrip dat meestal gebaseerd is op het idee van een constante aanwezigheid geen rekening houdt met de temporele en existentiële dimensies van het zijn heidegger stelt voor dat een begrip van het zijn een analyse vereist van dasein dat niet alleen gekenmerkt wordt door zijn bestaan maar ook door zijn zijn in de wereld en zijn tijdelijke bestaan het concept van dasein staat centraal in zijn betoog en benadrukt dat dasein zich altijd al in een wereld bevindt en dat zijn begrip van het zijn gevormd wordt door zijn tijdelijke bestaan dit perspectief daagt de traditionele metafysische noties van het zijn als statisch en onveranderlijk uit en stelt in plaats daarvan voor dat het zijn fundamenteel tijdelijk is en verbonden met het menselijk bestaan en begrip zoals de titel al suggereert ziet heidegger de kwestie van het zijn als niet te onderscheiden van de tijd en stelt hij dat newtoniaanse opvattingen van tijd als een reeks nu punten ontoereikend zijn om het wezen van dasein te begrijpen zijn ontochronologie stelt dat de existentiële en ontologische analyse van

dasein een fundamenteel concept van tijd onthult een concept dat integraal deel uitmaakt van de structuur van het zijn zelf de tekst gaat verder in op het idee van geworpenheid en verschillende andere existentialistische thema's geworpenheid is een van de drie voorwaarden die de onderdompeling van dasein in de wereld betekenen waar het zichzelf al verstrikt ziet in een web van relaties en betekenis deze geworpenheid in combinatie met daseins inherente op de dood zijn onderstreept de existentiële conditie van menselijke wezens die hun bestaan inkaderen als een voortdurende betrokkenheid bij hun eigen eindigheid en de mogelijkheden van hun wezen heidegger stelt dat het begrijpen van de aard van het zijn een fundamentele heroverweging van zowel het zijn als de tijd vereist en stelt dogmatisch dat de ware aard van het zijn alleen begrepen kan worden door een begrip van de tijdelijkheid die het bestaan van het zijn kenmerkt

despite his predominance in twentieth century philosophy no intellectual biography of martin heidegger has yet appeared this account of heidegger's personal relations originally published in german and extensively corrected by the author for this translation enlarges our understanding of a complex figure a well known art historian and an intimate friend of heidegger's heinrich wiegand petzet provides a rich portrait of heidegger that is part memoir part biography and part cultural history by recounting chronologically a series of encounters between the two friends from their meeting in 1929 until the philosopher's death in 1976 as well as between heidegger and other contemporaries petzet reveals not only new aspects of heidegger's thought and attitudes toward the historical and intellectual events of his time but also the greater cultural and social context in which he articulated his thought

a biographical account of two major thinkers of the twentieth century a relationship marked as much by estrangement and distance as reunion and friendship how could hannah arendt a german jew who fled germany in 1931 have reconciled with martin heidegger whom she knew had joined and actively participated in the nazi party in this remarkable biography antonia grunenberg tells how the relationship between arendt and heidegger embraced both love and thought and made their passions inseparable both philosophically and romantically grunenberg recounts how the history between arendt and heidegger is entwined with the history of the twentieth century with its breaks catastrophes and crises against the violent backdrop of the last century she details their complicated and often fissured relationship as well as their intense commitments to thinking focuses on a relationship that began when arendt was a student in the 1920s was broken between 1933 and 45 and resumed after the war the chronicle of higher education

a well crafted and careful rendering of an important and demanding volume covering the philosopher s views on language life and politics andrew mitchell emory university in these lectures delivered in 1933 1934 while he was rector of the university of freiburg and an active supporter of the national socialist regime martin heidegger addresses the history of metaphysics and the notion of truth from heraclitus to hegel first published in german in 2001 these two lecture courses offer a sustained encounter with heidegger s thinking during a period when he attempted to give expression to his highest ambitions for a philosophy engaged with politics and the world while the lectures are strongly nationalistic they also attack theories of racial supremacy in an attempt to stake out a distinctively heideggerian understanding of what it means to be a people this careful translation offers valuable insight into heidegger s views on language truth animality and life as well as his political thought and activity

this collection of texts originally published in german under the title holzwege is heidegger s first post war book and contains some of the major expositions of his later philosophy of particular note are the origin of the work of art perhaps the most discussed of all of heidegger s essays and nietzsche s word god is dead which sums up a decade of nietzsche research although translations of the essays have appeared individually in a variety of places this is the first english translation to bring them all together as heidegger intended the text is taken from the last edition of the work which contains the author s final corrections together with important marginal annotations that provide considerable insight into the development of his thought this fresh and accurate new translation will be an invaluable resource for all students of heidegger whether they work in philosophy literary theory religious studies or intellectual history

what is the meaning of being this is the central question of martin heidegger s profoundly important work in which the great philosopher seeks to explain the basic problems of existence a central influence on later philosophy literature art and criticism as well as existentialism and much of postmodern thought being and time forever changed the intellectual map of the modern world as richard rorty wrote in the new york times book review you cannot read most of the important thinkers of recent times without taking heidegger s thought into account this first paperback edition of john macquarrie and edward robinson s definitive translation also features a new foreword by heidegger scholar taylor carman

the tragedy of totalitarianism one of the most important turns in the modern philosophy and history of the west undergirds the intellectual relationship between martin heidegger and hannah arendt the rise of totalitarianism caused the disruption of traditional metaphysical and political categories and the necessity of a painstaking forging of new languages for the description of reality this book argues that arendt s answer to heidegger s philosophy intelligible only within the wider context of both thinkers struggles with the philosophical tradition of the west also

opens up a new horizon of conceptualizing the relationship between philosophy and education paulina sosnowska develops arendt s thesis of the broken thread of tradition and situates it in the wider context of heideggerian philosophy and his entanglement with nazism and consequently questions the traditional relationship between philosophy and education the final parts of this book return to the problem of dialogue between philosophy thinking and university education in times when the political and ethical framework is no longer determined by the continuity of tradition but the caesura of twentieth century totalitarianism

in this book federico dal bo analyzes the question of heidegger s anti semitism from a deconstructive point of view appealing not only to philosophy but also to psychoanalysis gender studies and critical studies deconstruction famously discourages simplistic oppositions whilst encouraging a more careful analysis of cultural and philosophical

complexities of a semantic field in the present case a deconstructive analysis of heidegger s anti semitism rejects both a stern condemnation of his oeuvre and a simplistic acquittal from this infamous accusation it rather suggests that the question of his anti semitism shall be examined from the broader perspective from the end of metaphysics

heidegger and ethics is a contentious conjunction of terms martin heidegger himself rejected the notion of ethics while his endorsement of nazism is widely seen as unethical this major new study examines the complex and controversial issues involved in bringing them together by working backwards through his work from his 1964 claim that philosophy has been completed to being and time his first major work joanna hodge questions heidegger s denial that his enquires were concerned with ethics she discovers a form of ethics in heidegger s thinking which elucidates his important distinction between metaphysics and philosophy against many contemporary views she proposes therefore that ethics can be retrieved and questions the relation between ethics and metaphysics that heidegger had made so pervasive
